For God will show all the earth your splendor: you will be named by God forever the peace of justice, the glory of God's worship.

Led away on foot by their enemies they left you: but God will bring them back to you borne aloft in glory as on royal thrones. The forests and every fragrant kind of tree have overshadowed Israel at God's command; for God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company.


PHILIPPIANS 1:4-6, 8-11

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. 




